An armed conflict of extreme violence is ravaging Sudan since the 15th of April while the civil population is caught between the clashes of two brutal armies, the SAF (Sudanese Armed Forces) and the RSF (Rapid Support Forces). This seminar aims at unfolding and debating some of the complex roots of this tragic event, by tackling the dynamics through which these today-enemies yet former allies gained power and wealth in Sudan, the flaws of the International Community interventions, and the untold forms of resistance and solidarity among civilian during the conflict. It also reveals the connectivity between the ongoing war and the constant endeavours of aborting the peaceful Sudanese Revolution, which in April 2019 succeeded in ousting the Islamist regime in power since 1989, and continues until today its fight for a civilian rule and democratic change.
